Which apostle was killed first (by Herod)?

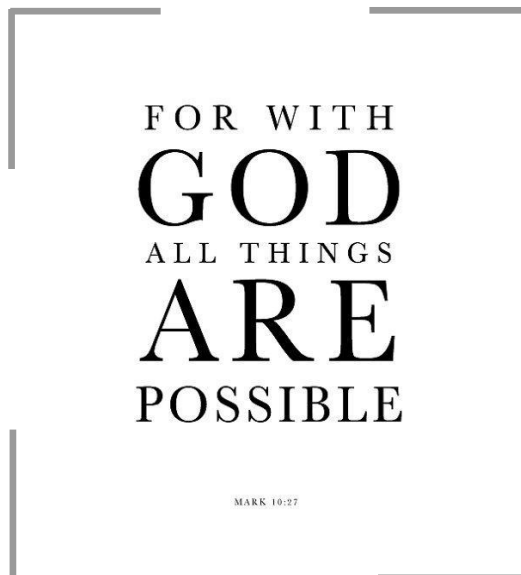
There are many things that people do that they regret, but there are certain things that we as Christians will never be sorry for. We will never be sorry for:
